

Overview

This CME course will be a comprehensive overview of nasal reconstruction. Nasal defects can be among the most challenging to repair, depending on the size, location, depth, and number of involved subunits. In this course, leading experts in the field will share their experience in the management of nasal defects, ranging from pearls for tough but commonly seen defects to innovative techniques to address complex multi-subsite and total nose defects. Attendees will gain tools to add to their armamentarium for nasal reconstruction to achieve optimal functional and aesthetic outcomes.

Objectives

- Describe methods and nuances of reconstructive options for wide range of nasal defects involving skin, framework, and lining
- Utilize case-based panels and discussions to compare and contrast different reconstructive methods and approaches for similar defects
- Identify common challenges and pitfalls of nasal reconstruction and provide novel solutions
- Describe innovative and novel reconstructive methods for challenging nasal defects and deformities, including total and sub-total nose and multi-subunit and full thickness defects
- Propose treatment algorithms, including techniques and timing, when managing complex defects that require several stages of reconstructive surgery
- Review the experience and techniques of leading experts in the field of nasal reconstruction
